MELFA DINNER PLAN 1968

LOCATION: New Westminster, B.C. — auditorium of Royal Canadian Legion.

OUR MELFA DINNER

THE WHOLE EXECUTIVE IS THE COMMITTEE FOR THIS EVENT, AND THEY WOULD LIKE, WITH YOUR HELP, TO MAKE THIS REUNION ONE TO BE REMEMBERED.

There are still men around who served in the 104th Bn. before the first Great War; this unit was followed by the 47th Bn., 131st Bn., The Westminster Regt. (M) First and Second Bns. Anyone who served at any time, with one of the aforementioned units is eligible for Membership in The Westminster Regiment Association.

It should be remembered that The Westminster Regiment is the oldest unit in B.C. It came into existence in 1863 when the Royal Engineers were disbanded. These men were formed into a Reserve Army Unit and there has been a continuity of the same Reserve Unit to the present day; it is now The Royal Westminster Regiment.

During two World Wars, many Decorations were won by Officers and other ranks of the 47th Bn. and The Westminster Regiment and those that we are proudest of are the two Victoria Crosses. One won by Corporal Filip Konowal, V.C., during the Great War and the other by Major Jack Mahony during the Second Great War. We have been members of Units that we can be very proud of.

The Westminster Regiment is affiliated with an Imperial Unit, The Royal Warwickshire Regiment. This unit was founded by William, Prince of Orange, in 1674, as the 6th Foot, and became The Royal Warwickshire Regiment in 1881. The colours of this Unit are Blue and Orange and we are privileged, as an affiliated Unit, to wear those colours.

The Queen's Colour and The Regimental Colour will be paraded here at the Melfa Dinner. We are very proud of these colours, and as they are paraded before and after the dinner, everyone present will stand to attention to show their pride and devotion.

A Salute To The Boys From The 47th, 104th, 131st.

1968 marks the 50th anniversary of the cessation of hostilities of "The Great War". It has been a memorable and changing 50 years but the memory of your magnificent contribution is as sharp and poignant as if it were yesterday. Your glorious, selfless sacrifices at The Marne, The Somme, Vimy and other notable places will live in the annals of history for all time to come. It is with pleasure that I reprint this poem from John E. Harrington of San Diego, Calif. It is a fine piece of writing. — Ed.

OUR ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Association relies on you, the readers of The Groundsheet, to encourage likely candidates to apply for our annual scholarship. In these days of high costs of university education the \$500 that goes with our award is worth having. It may make the difference between getting and not getting a year of valuable training. It was to help worthy sons and daughters of old comrades that we established the scholarship, and we want them to know about the opportunity — not only to win the money but also to carry the distinction that goes with the award. But don't expect young students to know about the scholarship. Some will have seen notices in university calendars and other academic publications, but The Groundsheet is the only news medium that reaches all our people in Canada and abroad. Please pass the word.

You remember that a student, to be eligible, must (a) be a descendant (son, danghter, grandson, grand-daughter) of one who served with The Westminsters or with one of its predecessors — the 47th, the 104th, and the 131st Battalions. (One who is presently serving with The Royal Westminster Regiment but who is NOT so descended is not eligible).

(b) have completed by July 31 this year, or previously, high-school graduation or its equivalent, and be proceeding to studies in an institution "of higher learning". The B.C. Institute of Technology or similar institution comes within the meaning of that term.

Something new has been added this year. Since we have reached the place where, for some applicants, filial eligibility cannot readily be established by employing the memories of members of the scholarship committee or other local referees, we are requiring that ALL applicants provide "official" assurance of their relationship to members of The Westminsters or its predecessors. This assurance may be obtained in this way: write to Mr. Walter Tyler, V.W.S.,

Department of Veterans' Afairs, 1231 Haro Street, Vancouver 5, B.C.

(Important: mark your envelope PERSONAL!)

Mr. Tyler will use resources immediately available to him to provide the "official assurance" needed. In difficult cases he or the applicant or both may have to refer to War Archives or War Service Records, Ottawa. Obviously, the more detail given Mr. Tyler, the more readily will assurance be established. Since all documents pertinent to applications must be mailed to our committee by July 31, communications re filial eligibility should not be delayed.

Application forms may be obtained by writing to our Association P.O. box number, or directly to I. F. Douglas, 824 Ladner Street, New Westminster, B.C. The Scholarship Committee meets in August after all applications have been assembled for examination. It is expected that each candidate will have been advised of the results before the end of the third week in August.
