The Regiment Reports:

This spring has the making of a very busy one for the serving members of the regiment. The unit is on a two company est. (Since Militia Re-organization of last year). A. Coy is designated as our FMC Coy. This stands for Forces Mobile Command which is the fieldforce tasked with the primary defence of the realm. The Westie's responsibility to FMC is to provide one coy. of trained infantrymen. At present the coy. is training hard under their OC Major C.G. Marshall, to be ready for MOB (Mobile Command) concentration at Wainwright the first part of July . . . The 3rd PPPCLI of Victoria, B.C. are responsible for the MOBCOM Training this summer and the Westies are looking forward to working with their counterparts in the regular force.

Our other Coy. B. Coy is under Capt. G. Potter who is responsible for recruit training. The first group of recruits from September's intake graduated the last week of January . . . They

were presented with their lanyards symbolic of recruit trg. comletion, by Col. D. S. Anderson the District Commander. Some seventy recruits are presently undergoing training and should graduate on April 3rd. This Easter the Regiment will concentrate at the CFB camp at Chilliwack along with other units from the Van. Militia District for a four day camp. The trained soilders will be living in the field in a dug in defensive position. The pick and shovel are still well known infantry tools. All will be fed due to the untiring efforts of Food Services Officer Mike Kedsiora whoes cooks provide gastronomic delights hardly thought possible on a field cooker. Sincere thanks are extended to Honorary Col. Brig. Gen Eakins who's generosity has made it possible for the Regimental Museum to acquire a very old historic piano once the property of the 104th Westminster Fusiliers. Of course the big news currently is the forthcoming Royal Visit of Her Majesty The Queen and Prince Phillip and Princess Anne on May 7th. The Regiment has been asked to turn out on that day and the band is to play for the civic luncheon at which Her Majesty will be guest of honor. As you can imagine the boots are already receiving extra care and band under Lt. J. J. Grierson is practicing for their musical presen-tation . . . that one of these awards be "preferably given for a non-academic application."

This recommended change will be offered as a motion at the Annual General Meeting. If it is approved the change will take place in 1972 and not before because the Association is committed already for 1971 for the one award of \$500, through the publications of the various institutions and universities.

The phrase "non-academic" is one that has already sparked some lively discussion in the executive and no doubt will also at the Annual General Meeting.

Briefly stated, apart from the idea of making two awards (which at \$250. still will be of considerable help in furthering the education of two descendents of members) the Committee feels we should encourage vocational education as well as academic. So such s c h o o l s as the Vocational Institutes would be added to those institutions where the money may be spent.

The committee has not recommended any changes apart from that already noted above.


