



The Regiment

The soldiers of the Royal Westminster Regiment have completed another tough summer of training and have moved into a new training year with many accolades. Major David Vernon was awarded the US army Commendation Medal for his action and service in the Joint Headquarters in Afghanistan. WO Mike Bergan attended the National Sniper Shooting Competition this past summer and brought back a 3rd place finish. Cpl. Neal Carmen (a Westie recipient of the Sacrifice Medal) and Sgt. Dean Baron participated in the mountain expedition as part of Outward Bound to raise awareness for the Wounded Warriors program. Cpl. Carmen has continued to his next objective, now having his sights set on scaling Mount Everest as part of the same program.

Three of our Westies Participated in selection for the Canadian Special Operation Regiment (CSOR) and were selected. Cpl. Thiesen, Cpl. Litzenberger and Cpl. D'Astoli will now take part in the national competition to become member of CSOR which falls under the Canadian Special Operations Forces Command, which includes JTF-2.

Returning from tour are Sgt. Joe Pingernon and MCpl. Tustin. They have brought back operational skills and knowledge learned as they took part in Operation Attention. Cpl. O'Keefe is currently deployed in Kabul, Afghanistan as part of the same Operation.

This year will be unlike any other in our history for a number of reasons.

The Westies have just kicked off the beginning of another great training year with. 2013 marks our Unit's 150th anniversary and it will be a year of great celebration. The Westies are ready to embark on a celebration of 150 years in the proud tradition of service and leadership within both our great nation and our community. The Royal Westminster Regiment is the oldest active military unit in British Columbia parading 282 soldiers this past September.

The westies have come a long way since then, but have still kept true to their values and horning those that have severed and scarified before them. There have been many new and exciting things that have come about over the last training year. The regiment is realizing a new book put together my Sgt. Harley, It chronicles the important events over the last 150 years in the regiment's history. In addition the Westie family is growing exponentially, and with this increase size has come the largest influx of Officer Recruits the unit has seen in almost a decade. As a result t of this, the commanding staff has instituted for the first time, a mentorship programme, unique the Regiment specifically tailored and designed to mold the mind of these young Officer Cadets into, competent leaders able to command troops both in garrison duties and in combat under the most challenging of circumstances. The mentorship programme is not only preparing these officer cadets with the infantry skills and tactics they will need to complete their phase training, but also the much needed administrative skills as well as developing them mentally by

nurturing and developing their leadership and warrior ethos, the hallmarks of any good officer. Officer Cadets coming off of their phase 1, Common Army Phase, training this past summer will tell you, the mentorship program has been an invaluable experience.

Adding to the growth of the regiment are the new order sent down from brigade moving our "B" company form their home in Aldergrove to their new home at Area Support Unit Chilliwack. The Westies are the are contender for the largest infantry unit in the province, tied only I with the Canadian Scottish Regiment on Vancouver Island. With this new move there is even greater potential for more growth and development of the Westie family.

Major David Vernon is currently attached to 39 Canadian Brigade HQ in the planning cell (G5) assisting with the development of the Territorial Brigade Group for Domestic Operations and the move into old Area Support Unit Chilliwack (formally known as CFB Chilliwack). Capt Todd Phillps is currently attached to Joint Task Force North located in Whitehorse NWT as a staff officer in the Operations cell of (G3).

Major Chuck Mackinnon participated in Exercise Rapid Trident, a NATO and partners for Peace exercise conducted near Lviv, Ukraine. The exercise consisted of a US/Ukraine Brigade Headquarters and a Multi-National Brigade Headquarters plus various nations conducting STX (scenario training exercises). Canada assisting and providing its knowledge in Counter-Improvised Explosive Devices (C-IED). Major Mackinnon worked in the Multi-National Brigade HQ planning cell (G5).

Sgt. Todd Singer commissioned form the ranks (CFR) to become a lieutenant.

Something New Offered Royal United Services Institute and Vancouver Military Studies Conference Summary offered by: Jerry Gangur

Have you ever wondered what it would be like to be briefed about Canada's military role in the world by a series of generals, colonels and professors? What would it be like to meet and ask questions of senior officers who commanded major Canadian operations in Afghanistan? In the same room you would have historians offering their perspective and frank assessment of the likely long term lasting success of Canada's effort. Well, this is what awaits anyone who attends conferences sponsored by the Vancouver Military Studies organization.

Working with the Royal United Services Institute (RUSI), this was the second annual conference organized by the Vancouver Military Studies Conference (VMSC). One of the objectives of the RUSI is to provide a forum for public discussion and information. To this end the conference recruits quality speakers, both from military and civilian sources. The military group consists of serving and retired senior officers. On the civilian side, we see very able military historians, who may have views that offer very sober assessment of the long term success of our military contribution to some parts of the world.

Often little tidbits of information, as offered by Professor Terry Copp, are offered. In one instance, he referred to the optimism of the artillery planners, providing covering support for advancing troops during world war one. A medical team visited wounded personnel and recorded the number of wounded having shrapnel which originated from friendly fire. To find out the percentage of casualties suffered by friendly fire, you have to attend a lecture or scroll the internet.

One of the highlights of the two day conference was a presentation by BGen Andre Corbould, OMM, CD, the third grandson of the regiments' WW2 commanding officer, Lieutentant Colonol Corbould. BGen. Corbould was the former Deputy Commander of the 10 US Mountain Division (this Division relieved the Canadian Task Force in Kandahar, Afghanistan in 2011). His presentation was made together by a US Colonel who worked with BGen. Corbould. Hearing of the close coordination and cooperation between the commanders of both armies is most encouraging.

In summary the quality of personnel and information provided by the speakers is first class and all are encourage to attend the conference in year 12013. For further information go to: www.rusivancouver.ca.
