

THE ROYAL WESTMINSTER REGIMENT ASSOCIATION ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 1992

<u>Minutes</u> - of 1991 Meeting accepted, as circulated. McIntyre-Low.

President gave a review of correspondence - by motion Stephens - Hammersley. It was all ordered to be given to Groundsheet editor, in due course.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> - four page report circulated. A copy of which is appended to the original of these minutes. Bank balance as of this date \$3,701.24; term deposits \$26,000.00 due July 1992. Subsequent renewals to be dated within the calendar year in order to give a true picture of interest earned during 1992. The manner of showing the budgetary loss of \$620.47 was explained. (Bracketed instead of red). Lt. Housman questioned the depreciation of "Dues". President Smithers outlined the philosophy of The Association. A question was raised; "Did the \$26,000.00 include the Eakins endowment?" Response - Yes. Financial Report accepted - motion Conway - Moorhouse.

Membership - Life Members 170. Ordinary for 1992 - 52 paid. Officers Mess 22 paid tonight. Sgts. Mess. pending - 20 in number. Mens Mess (Jr. Ranks) a disappointment to The Association. This could be our own fault. Do we show enough interest or is there mutual support? Some discussion to set up trust account for Life Membership dues? Hughes suggested a special dues structure should be set up for Jr. Ranks reduced rates? Hyska invited the Association Executive to Jr. Ranks General Meeting in April? Report accepted Moorhouse-Conway.

<u>Groundsheet</u> - Editor's report appended. His report - in absentia - received loud applause. Special motion to request he continue - Eaton - Hammersley unanimous, please do.

<u>Co's Report</u> - As attached - presented by Bill McKinney who prefaced the report with apologies for the absence of The Regiment due to a weekend exercise in Yakima. Also related news that there would be no reorganization of the Inf. Bde


Sqts Mess - No report.

The Income and Expense Statement is prepared on a cash basis which is consistent with the previous year's Statement.

Term Deposits consist of the following:

 (a) One-year G.I.C. for \$19,400.00 maturing on January 13, 1992 at an interest rate of 9.10% per annum.

- (b) One-year G.I.C. for \$5,600.00 with maturity date of January 13, 1992 at an interest rate of 10.65% per annum.
- Note: Interest earned from the above-mentioned "Guaranteed Investment Certificates" totalled \$2,219.97 and has been deposited to our account as of January 13, 1992. We have re-invested \$26,000.00 in G.I.C. maturing July 15, 1992 at 6.5%. We plan on re-investing this to mature as of December 31, 1992 in order that the interest earned in 1992 is reflected in the December 31, 1992 financial statements.

CO'S REPORT FOR THE ASSOCIATION A.G.M.

1. <u>Highlights of Unit Activities</u>

(a) Hyack Festival

The Regiment and Band had an Annual Parade and Inspection immediately following the Hyack Anvil Battery salute on the Queen's Birthday at Queen's Park. The following Saturday the Regiment and Band marched in the Hyack Parade.

(b) Milcon 91

The Regiment participated in the annual Militia Concentration conducted at CFB Wainwright. Training was conducted at the Company level and consisted of section live fire attacks, fighting in built up areas, mechanised operations and fighting and urban patrols.

(c) <u>Gun Camp - Fort Lewis</u>

The Regiment conducted live section attacks and live house clearing drills at Fort Lewis as part of the fall Gun Camp.

(d) Regimental Dinner

General John de Chastelain CMM CD, the Chief of Defence Staff was our guest at our dinner on the 22 February 1992. <u>Co's Report</u> (cont'd.)

(e) Church Parade and Christening

The Regiment and Band conducted a Church Parade and Regimental Christening on the 8 March 1992 at Holy Trinity Church. Thirteen children were christened. Bibles kindly donated by the Association, for each child, were presented at the reception in the church hall.

(f) Airborne Platoon

The airborne platoon continued to jump throughout the year at such places as Reno, Nevada and Honolulu.

2. <u>Strength</u>

Recruiting continues to gradually increase the strength. B Company has been restarted in Abbotsford and uses our Cadet Facilities at Aberdeen Hall. The effective strength of the Regiment and Band is 132.

3. Land Forces Western Area (LFWA)

As of the beginning of September 1991 all units are under command of LFWA in Edmonton. Pacific Militia Area is now BC District Headquarters commanded by a full Colonel. This means that all Regulars and Reserves are not under a unified command structure.
