THE INCOMING COMMANDING OFFICER

Lieutenant-Colonel Robert A. (Bob) Lee is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Wilfrid E. Lee of Cobble Hill and formerly of Peterborough, Ontario. He joined the army as a Gunner in the 50th Field Artillery in Peterborough in 1960. After three years in the Militia, reaching the rank of Second Lieutenant, he entered the Regular Force attending Royal Roads and R.M.C. On graduation with a degree in Civil Engineering in 1967, he served as a combat engineer officer for a year in Gagetown and three with N.A.T.O. in Germany where he was promoted to Captain. Returning to Canada in 1971, he served two successive tours in base engineering at Comox B.C. and Penhold Alberta.

Lieutenant-Colonel Lee attended Staff College in Kingston in 1979 and Toronto in 1980 and then returned to B.C. to command 1 Combat Engineer Regiment in Chilliwack. In 1982 he was appointed Chief Instructor of the Canadian Forces School of Military Engineering. On promotion to Lieutenant-Colonel in 1983 he moved to Ottawa where he joined the Directorate of Professional Education and Development with responsibility for revamping the Officers Professional Development Program. In 1985, he was appointed the Construction Project Manager for the design and construction of the North Warning System (a chain of 48 radar stations and five forward fighter bases straddling the Arctic Circle from Alaska to Labrador to replace the D.E.W. line). He returned to BC again in 1988 to the position of Deputy Chief of Staff at the area Headquarters at Jericho Beach On retirement from the Regular Force he took up the position of Assistant City Engineer and Emergency Planning Coordinator for Coguitlam.

Lieutenant Colonel Lee has a daughter Elizabeth who is a student and a former member of The Royal Westminster Regiment Cadet Corps.
